***FISCAL FRIDAYS* INTERVIEW WITH CHRIS CHRISTIE ON TAX,
SPENDING PLANS TO APPEAR ONLINE TOMORROW**

Republican presidential candidate Chris Christie will discuss his tax and spending proposals in a live interview that will appear online at 3:45 p.m. EST tomorrow, Jan. 20, as part of *Fiscal Fridays*, the public affairs television series on the New Hampshire-based [NH1 News Network](http://NH1NewsNetwork.com).

In the studio interview Christie, the New Jersey governor, will respond to questions about the growing national debt, how to address it, and the specific fiscal and economic policies he would pursue if elected president.

The half-hour program will appear live online Wednesday starting at 3:45 p.m. EST. The program will air on WBIN-TV and 99.1 NH1 News this Friday, Jan. 22 at 1:00 p.m. EST. In addition, a video will be available later on both the NH1 and [First Budget](http://FirstBudget.com) websites.

Fiscal Fridays -- a project of First Budget, a joint nonpartisan initiative of the Campaign to Fix the Debt and The Concord Coalition -- gives New Hampshire primary voters and the country at large the opportunity to hear directly from the candidates on the policies they would pursue in their first budget as president. Other co-sponsors of the series are NH1, the Business and Industry Association of New Hampshire, and the Warren B. Rudman Center at the University of New Hampshire's Law School.
